The South Australian Schools Network Outreach Team (SNOT) works with schools in Adelaide and beyond to encourage action around Amnesty International's human rights work. The SA SNOT Leader will lead the local team as part of a regional and a national network of committed volunteers working with schools across Australia to empower young people in their human rights activism.

Key Responsibilities

- Manage SNOT members, including rostering for school workshops and events and succession planning for any outgoing members
- Prepare discussions, workshops, seminars and other events with students about the value of advocacy in protecting human rights (with supporting materials from Amnesty)
- Expand and strengthen our schools network through outreach and mentoring:
 - reach out to new schools to establish school groups;
 - reinvigorate existing school groups; and
 - strengthen relationships with active school groups.
- Respect AIA's policies, including those in regards to impartiality and independence
- Commit a minimum of five hours per fortnight including attending face to face meetings, video or phone meetings and school visits.
- Commit to a minimum of 12 months in this volunteer role.
