International - Occupied Palestinian Territory

Call for permanent ceasefire and end to Israel's siege on Gaza



Call for unhindered aid to Gaza



Call for an end to apartheid and Israel's occupation of the Palestinian Territory



Call for an end to genocide in Gaza



End the direct or indirect sale or transfer of weapons or weapon components to Israel

International - China

Make human rights in Xinjiang, Tibet and Hong Kong and release of Dr Yang Hengjun central to bilateral relationship



Work with other governments and at the UN to hold the Chinese government accountable



Protect diaspora communities from transnational repression by China



End import of products from China using forced labour of Uyghurs and Tibetans



International - Myanmar

Work with governments worldwide to hold the military in Myanmar accountable for war crimes



International - Afghanistan

Work with governments worldwide to hold the Taliban responsible for human rights abuses in particular rights of women and girls
