## Prue Spencer

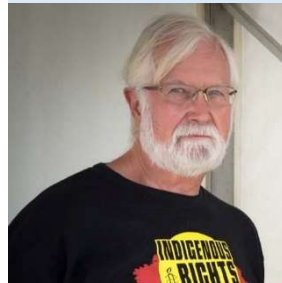


Prue Spencer is a member of Amnesty International Australia's (AIA) Youth Advisory Group (YAG).
